## **Treehouse Cafe...revisited**

One year ago, Treehouse Cafe was featured as the first "Job Site of the Month," and for good reason: Treehouse was one of Kingsway's original Community Based Instruction (CBI) job sites back in 2005.

Kingsway students continue to work and learn at this location, doing a number of tasks, such as cleaning tables, sweeping, dishwashing, restocking the coffee station, and wrapping baked goods. Student Nisa J. worked at Treehouse Cafe when she first entered the CBI Program a few years ago. As students rotate through a variety of structured learning experiences, students like Nisa revisit and practice familiar routines when they return to past sites.

# An old friend drops by the Treehouse!

An example of this includes food preparation. Nisa has sharpened her skills and is back at Treehouse putting those skills to use.

"Nisa follows a recipe and is able to independently prepare baked goods, such as scones, muffins, cookies, and monkey bread," says Theresa Monaco, Kingsway job coach. "She also assists in the cooking area while taking direction from site staff."

During this visit, Nisa is working with Treehouse employees Haleigh and Peaches, as everyone gears up for the lunch rush. It's time to make vegan sausage patties and Nisa gets her instructions from Haleigh.

"Nisa does a great job," says
Haleigh, "I explain what she needs to do,
then she's ready to work on her own."
As instructed, Nisa scoops out the vegan
sausage mixture and forms the pattie in
the baking pan. She listens carefully,
asks questions and focuses on the job at
hand.

Nisa is at ease working in the kitchen and clearly enjoys it. "I like making the sweet things the best," she says. Later in today's visit, Nisa prepares monkey bread with direction from Peaches.

While Nisa works in the kitchen, Emily R. is busy in the dining area filling in supplies at the coffee station and trimming the paper used to wrap sandwiches. A patron walks by and says

to her, "Nice job!" and Emily smiles proudly.

"The staff and management are fantastic with our students. They really understand our mission," says Ms. Monaco, who has been a job coach for seven of her 13 years at Kingsway. "The particular tasks that are assigned go hand-in-hand and are appropriate for each student's capabilities."

It's been 14 years since this cozy cafe became one of Kingsway's first CBI job sites. Many thanks to owners Randy & Tina Van Osten, as they continue their partnership with Kingsway. ◆

# Work Readiness Class cuts ribbon on The Snack Shack

The ribbon has officially been cut on Kingsway's newest inschool business venture: The Snack Shack. The students and staff in Rose Neufeld's Work Readiness Class are responsible

for this corner shop, which sells snacks, coffee, tea, and baked goods, as well as Kingsway gear.

This class works in shifts, either in the cafe or the Snack Shack.

"I enjoy watching my students master different skills," says Ms. Neufeld, "particularly their social interaction with customers."

Some of the day-to-day routine includes pricing, stocking, ordering inventory, packaging, setting up and running the cash register, greeting customers, and cleaning up the shop.

"Most importantly, students work on teamwork skills to provide students and staff a positive experience while visiting the school store and cafe," says Donna Stone,

occupational therapist.

Like any successful business, The Snack Shack looks for ways to attract customers and keep them coming back, as well as working in concert with other classroom projects.

"We will be featuring items to be sold from the Tools for Life domain [a class that focuses on the safe use of household implements]," says Ms. Neufeld. "Reusable coffee cups, which can be refilled at a discounted price, will be ready soon. Every five purchases equals a free coffee," says Ms. Neufeld.
